**Sports Premium Plan 2019 - 2020**

All schools receive a lump sum of £16,000 plus a premium of £10 per pupil for pupils in years 1-6. Our aim is to continue to improve the quality of PE provision through the best teaching, enable all pupils to lead a healthy lifestyle, encourage our pupils to try something new, or improve current skills. By providing these opportunities we hope that they will develop a life-long love of PE and Sport and lead active lifestyles well into adulthood. We also encourage older pupils to become young leaders. We want the experiences to be positive, fun and fulfilling and we look forward to the promise that this funding will bring.

**Sports Premium Allocation**

The government document PE and sport Premium for Primary schools states that possible uses for the funding include:

- Develop or add to the PE, physical activity and sport activities that school already offers
- Build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years

At Primrose Hill C of E Primary Academy we have been running a programme of professional development in PE for teachers, whereby staff are given the opportunity to observe and team teach with our PE specialists. This year we will continue to employ a Sports Premium Lead who is sharing her expertise and passion side by side with the teachers and pupils, leading staff meetings and working with teachers to provide high quality PE lessons.

The Sports funding has enabled us to sign up to the Youth Sports Trust, which provides us with even more professional development opportunities through courses, support and expertise from specialist PE teachers. The YST also organise events across the Forest of Dean in a wide variety of sports, both competitive and with the aim of broadening children's experiences.

Funding for 2019 -2020 will allow us to continue to offer children in KS1 and KS2 a range of after school clubs that are run by our specialist P.E teacher and staff within the school. Depending on the activity, these clubs are open to all our children to develop skills that have been taught in their P.E lessons and offer new sports. The clubs will be timetabled to coincide with competitions that are organised by the PE coordinator and Sports Premium Lead. In addition a range of extra curricular opportunities will be available, and will be run with the focus being on children who are reluctant to engage in sporting activities; pupil premium children in Years 1 - 6 will be encouraged to attend.

As a result of the provision on offer, the school will be aiming to achieve School Games Platinum award at the end of 2020 by offering the regular daily physical activity, high profile PE and sport to support whole school improvement, confident, knowledgeable and skilled staff, a broad range of opportunities for all and increased participation in competitive sport.
