Technology

We live in a tech heavy world and our children are often more tech savvy than we are.

As a school, we teach children about online safety and how to behave on line however, we still get messages from parents about inappropriate behaviour from This may take the form of inappropriate children. messages, excluding people from games on line or viewing inappropriate content. Obviously, a lot of this behaviour happens outside of school and therefore we rely on parents to set safety controls on children's devises. There are many things online that children are not yet ready to know, and parental safety settings serve as a vital protective measure. It is also vitally important to check your child's messages to ensure their communication is respectful and kind. If you discover any communication you are worried about please speak to a member of staff who will be able to facilitate conversations with the children in school.
